Task Force Members

- Expertise in disease prevention and health promotion of children and/or adults;
- Experience with systematic reviews, their methodology and their application to clinical decision-making and/or policy;
- Experience in guideline production;
- Ability to be rigorous but open-minded when reviewing and interpreting scientific evidence and associated recommendations;
- Ability to work collaboratively with peers;
- Strongest consideration will be given to individuals who are widely recognized for scholarly leadership within their fields of expertise;
- A background in family practice will be considered an asset

Vice-Chair

- A recognized leader;
- Excellent skills in consensus building, negotiating, and conflict resolution;
- Comfort speaking on behalf of the CTFPHC in public venues.

The Chair of the CTFPHC is the public face of the CTFPHC and provides strategic direction. The Vice Chair provides support to the Chair in these roles as needed.

The time commitment for the Vice-Chair position will vary depending on guidelines under development but overall a 0.25FTE time commitment can be expected.

Members of the Canadian Task Force on Preventive Health Care are appointed for a 4 year term, renewal once.
