### Details:

In 2017-2018, through a numbered corporation that I own, I have provided consultations to Medlior Health Outcomes Research Ltd (Medlior) related to the methodological rigor on protocols and systematic reviews they were conducting. The patient populations of the topics were on patients with advanced esophageal, cervical or prostate cancer and smoking cessation for patients diagnosed with cancer.
